About today's keyboard organ music: The melody of the Sussex Carol originated as a folksong in the town of Monk's Gate in Sussex, and the text was published in 1684 in "A Small Garden of Pious and Godly Songs" by Irish bishop Luke Wadding. The words proclaim a message of peace and goodwill: "On Christmas night all Christians sing, to hear the news the angels bring." The tune for *Un flambeau, Jeanette, Isabelle* first appeared in the Provence region of France, not as Christmas music, but rather, as dance music for the French nobility. In 1688 it was published in a collection of Christmas carols with Provençal texts, and in 1672 set to a drinking song for a revival of Molière's play *Le Médicin malgré lui*. The carol begins "Bring a torch, Jeanette, Isabella, Bring a torch, to the cradle run! It is Jesus, good folk of the village."
