### About today's keyboard music:

William Selby was an English organist and harpsichordist. In 1773, at age 35, he emigrated to America, following the lead of his brother John, also an organist, who had emigrated in 1771. Some denominations of early American churches allowed only unaccompanied singing, but in those allowing accompaniment, the organ was the only instrument used. The pipe organs were relatively small and mostly followed the design of the English organs of the time. William Selby's "A Lesson for the Organ" is a suite of three short pieces, the last of which is a brief, cheerful jig. As most English organs of the time had no pedals, the pieces are for manuals only and call for only a small number of stops.

"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, oh God" is the opening of Psalm 42. Seattle composer Martin Nystrom is best known for his song is based on the psalm and composed it while attending summer school at Christ for the Nations Institute in Texas

during the summer break from his teaching position. His roommate challenged him to go on a fast to afford more time for prayer and reading the Bible, and the song came to him when he spotted a Bible open to Psalm 42.
