About today's organ music: The hymn tune *Morning Song* was based on a folk tune and first appeared as a hymn in the 1813 "Repository of Sacred Music" published by John Wyeth. The tune is most often connected with the text "Awake, Awake to Love and Work," and this hymn is #89 in our hymnal. The topic of Jacob's ladder first began appearing in spirituals in the early 1800s, with a variety of texts and tunes, such as "Wrestle On, Jacob" and "Wake Up, Jacob." The version we are familiar with now was first published in 1907 in "Calhoun's Plantation Songs." The Postlude is in recognition of Veterans Day. Known as "the Navy Hymn," *Eternal Father, Strong to Save* was written in 1860 by William Whiting, who at age 35 was in a violent storm at sea and believed his life was spared by God. Inspired by Psalm 107, and associated with seafarers and the dangers of the sea, the hymn assures us that God quiets the storm and will bring us back safely.
