These are the tribes with whom we are walking together even today: the Kalapuya , tribes that include Tualatin (Atfalati), Yamhill (Yamel), Ahantchuyuk (Pudding River), Luckiamute, Santiam, Chepenefa (Mary's River), Chemapho (Muddy Creek), Tsankupi (Calapooia River), Mohawk (Mohawk River, OR; unrelated to the Mohawks of NY), Chafan (near Eugene), Chelamela (Long Tom River), Winefelly (Mohawk, McKenzie and Coast Forks of the Willamette River), and the Yoncalla peoples.

INVITATION TO THE TABLE COMMUNION PRAYER

One: Let us give thanks.

Many: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

One: Holy and gracious God, we thank you for your love made known in creation, in the covenant with your people, and most fully in Jesus Christ, who shared our life, who ate with sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection, you gave birth to your church, delivered us from sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. With thanksgiving, we remember that on the night of his betrayal, Jesus took bread, and when he had blessed it, he broke it and said: "This is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."
