

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE LAND

We offer the following acknowledgment of the communities of Indigenous People who first lived in the land we call the Willamette Valley. These are the tribes with whom we are walking together even today: the Kalapuya, tribes that include Tualatin (Atfalati), Yamhill (Yamel), Ahantchuyuk (Pudding River), Luckiamute, Santiam, Chepenefa (Mary's River), Chemapho (Muddy Creek), Tsankupi (Calapooia River), Mohawk (Mohawk River, OR; unrelated to the Mohawks of NY), Chafan (near Eugene), Chelamela (Long Tom River), Winefelly (Mohawk, McKenzie and Coast Forks of the Willamette River), and the Yoncalla peoples.

About today's organ music: The three Beethoven pieces are from his "Suite for a Mechanical Organ, Op. 39" composed in 1799. Although Beethoven studied the organ and played for a church, he composed only a few pieces for the organ. The "mechanical organ," for which the suite was intended, was a specific instrument, an organ operated by a clockwork mechanism (also referred to as a "flute-clock") owned by Count Josef Deym, who owned an art gallery in Vienna. A clockwork instrument can easily play any number of notes in any arrangement, while the same notes can be very awkward for human hands. Once the suite was finally published in 1902 for human organists, they have had to use creative fingerings and maneuvers to play and share these delightful pieces.

Family Promise Hosting Update: August 3-10

Our volunteer signup for hosting week is going well. We still have a space for you, though. See online link or visit our table in the Narthex on Sundays. If you are unable to physically do any job this time, but can donate monetarily, we will be buying lunch materials for the day center, where the families are located during the day. Any amount will help us in that endeavor.

We will have 4 families with us (10 adults and 5 children, ages 7-13).

One person does not eat gluten, but is not highly allergic, so if he does, it won't be a problem. We will provide a loaf of gluten-free bread and if you are providing a dessert that has gluten, just alert us.

adopted 1991

We are a Just Peace Church. We seek to keep the vision of shalom central to our corporate and individual lives, working to deepen our understanding of the many dimensions of peace and justice in our time. Through our worship, programs, and outreach, we seek to be a community of reconciliation, hope, and courage, as we work and pray for peace and justice in our world.

What Kind of Christians Are We?

By calling ourselves progressive Christians, we mean we are Christians who...

- 1. Believe that following the path and teachings of Jesus can lead to an awareness and experience of the Sacred and the Oneness and Unity of all life;
- 2. Affirm that the teachings of Jesus provide but one of many ways to experience the Sacredness and Oneness of life, and that we can draw from diverse sources of wisdom in our spiritual journey;
- 3. Seek community that is inclusive of ALL people, including but not limited to:

Conventional Christians and questioning skeptics,

Believers and agnostics,

People of other faiths and good will.

- 4. Know that the way we behave towards one another is the fullest expression of what we believe;
- 5. Find grace in the search for understanding and believe there is more value in questioning than in absolutes;
- 6. Strive for peace and justice among all people;
- 7. Strive to protect and restore the integrity of our Earth;
- 8. Commit to a path of life-long learning, compassion, and selfless love
